Governance Effectiveness Review

Background/Context

Liverpool John Moores University commissioned a strategic independent review of the effectiveness of its governance following an unplanned period without a Vice Chancellor, during which the Chair of the Board stepped up to take a more hands-on role.

This transition highlighted a need to examine the connectivity between the corporate governance and academic governance at the University on an ongoing basis, as well as a requirement to consider the boundary between governance and management and how that could best be shaped.

Solution

Advance HE used its governance survey, which offers benchmarking data against more than 35 institutions, and carried out a document review and interviews. The survey results were used to establish areas for improvement while the document review and observations were used to draw up priorities for attention.

These activities involved the Board, Academic Board, Chairs' Group, and the Employment, Infrastructure, Finance, Nominations and Audit Committees.

Outcomes

The review identified six key areas for recommendations, 25 in total, some of which were already in progress.

These included proposals on how to effectively engage the Board in a planned strategic review over the next year to frame future priorities; a clearer separation of governance and management; improved succession planning on the Board, continuance of work to improve Board and committee papers; a reconfiguration of the committee structure over time; and development of the secretariat to allow it to become more strategic and effective in supporting the Board.
